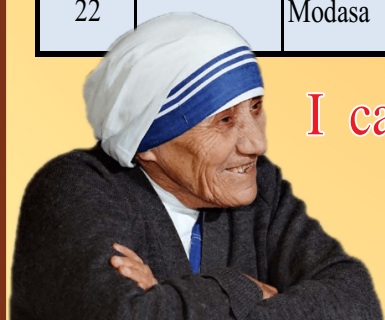

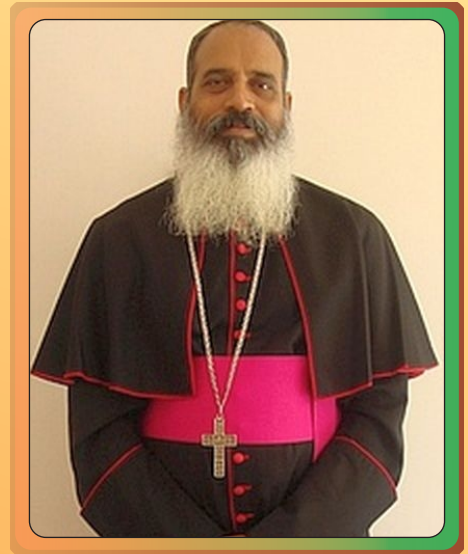

Message from Director



“I’m because of others” is a beautiful expression of a human being in this digitalized fast track world and Sabarmati Samruddhi Seva Sangh has lived this dictum in the year 2017-18, which I’m delighted to present in the Annual Report of SSSS, 2017-18.

SSSS played a vital support and facilitation role working with her associate partners and reference communities at the grass roots facing problems like lack of proper water supply, sanitation, distance from government schemes and differences in Public Distribution Systems, lack of immunization, poor quality of health care and education, malnutrition. SSSS capacitated them to improve their health status, fight for food and nutrition security and build themselves for economic up gradation.

SSSS was actively engaged during this year in supporting the families affected by floods in Banaskantha district especially in Dhanera, Kankrej and Deesa. The affected families were provided water and sanitation kits, ration kits, seed kits, blankets, etc. We could reach out to 1200 households and support them. Long term rehabilitation works are in progress.

SSSS has been effective through “Childline 1098” in ensuring child rights and protection in the district of Gandhinagar consisting of four talukas namely Dehgam, Mansa, Kalol and Gandhinagar. No doubt, it is a national, 24 hour free, emergency phone outreach service for children in need of care and protection linking them to long term rehabilitation and care, SSSS takes pride for being true to its objective. “Childline se Dosti” a national campaign was initiated by SSSS with the aim to make ordinary citizens stakeholders in Childline 1098 by pledging that they will be true friends of every child in need.

Based on the previous experience of forming and leading 4 women co-operatives (Credit & Saving Co-operative Societies Ltd.) at Khiloda, Meghraj, Nana Kantharia and Vadgam, SSSS is on the verge of forming another such 5 interventions through a program named “Sangath Life”. This humble beginning extensively looks forward with hope to accomplish a dream of a “Co-operative Bank” at the centre of the Social Apostolate.

During the year 2017-18, when SSSS has been working tirelessly in order to bring sustainable socio –economic development through its interventions of health, emergency relief, Children in need of care and protection and empowerment of women, I take this opportunity to extend my heartfelt thanks to all our supporters and donors, associate partners, grass roots community members, members of the Governing Body, General Body, SSSS Staff, for being co-travelers in our journey and contributing in the collective work of SSSS which believes in the “called to do good”. We are sure to continue and improve our services to thousands of marginalized people in North Gujarat in the coming year.

Preamble of the Organization

Sabarmati Samruddhi Seva Sangh, Gandhinagar(SSSS) is a Charitable, Voluntary, Non Government Organization working in six districts of North Gujarat namely Aravali, Banaskantha, Gandhinagar, Mehsana, Patan and Sabarkantha.

The Society & the Trust was registered with the Charity Commissioner on 19th July 2003, bearing Society reg. no Guj/1077/Gandhinagar & Trust reg. no. F/1033/Gandhinagar. Society also actively involved in promoting income generation programs through Women's Co-operatives.

In our commitment to building a strong volunteer-driven culture, we worked in forming Village Health Committee (VHC) Groups and a cadre of community residents who hold anganwadis and Primary Health Centers (PHC) accountable for service delivery. We conducted public awareness activities to improve uptake of ICDS services, while promoting good health practices.

Mother and Child Safety Project (MCS)

SSSS has Implemented Mother and Child Safety project with four partner centers in 18 villages of two Districts of Aravali and Sabarkantha. This project covered 7762 households and 41212 beneficiaries to reduce Infant Mortality Rate & Maternal Mortality Rate and to Increase complete ante natal care & post natal care.

Strengthening primary care

In rural areas Government provides free primary health services to communities. We worked with PHCs staff to develop effective processes, track its efficiency and facilitate community awareness building.

Sangath Life

On 12th November 2017, Sabarmati Samruddhi Seva Sangh launched a Project named “Sangath Life”- Strengthened Capacities of Collective Enterprise of 5 Cooperatives from the Tribal Communities of 2 Districts in Gujarat leading to their Empowerment and Socio-Economic Development. Through this intervention, we enrolled 2 credit cooperative societies namely **Mehsana** - Shree Divyajyot Mahila Bachat Ane Dhiran Sahakari Mandli Ltd. and **Mandali** – The Fatima Mahila Bachat Ane Dhiran Sahakari Mandli Ltd. against the target of 5. The other projected 3 are in the pipeline namely **Siddhpur** – Sanjivani Mahila Bachat Ane Dhiran Sahakari Mandli Ltd. **Kadi** - Sandhya Mahila Bachat Ane Dhiran Sahakari Mandli Ltd. and **Patan**. We enrolled 361 members into credit cooperative societies with total share capital of Rs. 1, 42,550/- and total saving of Rs. 2, 01,200/-. SSSS also provided training programs like Leadership, PRI, Marketing function & Strategies, Availing Credit Facilities. As a result, women heightened their confidence level and are involved in hard work for better future socio –economic status.

Earlier SSSS was instrumental in registering 5 credit cooperative societies namely **Meghraj** -The Jivandeep Adivasi Mahila Bachat Ane Dhiran Sahakari Mandli Ltd , **Nanakanthariya** -Shree Jyoti Adivasi Mahila Bachat Ane Dhiran Sahakari Mandli Ltd, **Asal** – The Sarita Adivasi Mahila Bachat Ane Dhiran Sahakari Mandli Ltd. **Vadgam** -The Pragati Mahila Bachat Ane Dhiran Sahakari Mandli Ltd, **Deesa** – Shakti Mahila Bachat Ane Dhiran Sahakari Mandli Ltd. against the target of 6, the one in the pipeline namely **Radhanpur** –Sanjivani Mahila bachat Ane Dhiran Sahakari Mandli Ltd. We enrolled 2658 members into credit cooperative societies with total share capital of Rs. 7,64,270/- having total saving of Rs. 64,24,553/- and have distributed loans to members worth Rs.16,75,310/-. Our initiatives have raised 35% of the trained participants to be involved in alternative livelihood who add income not only into their cooperative societies but to their family as well.

One of the cooperatives namely of Vadgam, involved in phenyl & petroleum jelly products, has been awarded a **cluster project** by Government of Gujarat for “Patchwork on clothes”. Members will have an opportunity to enhance their skills through different trainings designed by the government, foreign exposure visits and will also be provided with a spacious shop in a reputed area. Other cooperatives sell garments like sarees procured from textile giant city of Surat to sell them in their respective villages. Others are involved in procuring 200 liters & 500 liters of water tanks and selling them at a nominal price.

SSSS is widening the scope of women’s co-operatives at other social action centres too. Enrollment and membership is progressing along with the required initial trainings. Hopes of SSSS are high to bear fruits of establishing credit & saving cooperative societies, Ltd. that will see in future a “Co-operative bank” at the centre.



SSSS Gandhinagar Childline ensures 24x7 services for Child Rights and Protection funded by Childline India Foundation, Mumbai.

- During 2017-18, SSSS Gandhinagar Childline protected 313 children from their difficulties and were given true care & support.
- 117 children were provided medical support from civil hospital: 12 skin diseases, 91 high fever, 04 minor operations, 09 eye problems, 01 kidney problem.

- Education Sponsorship under RTE Act: 20 children admitted in Private as well as Government Schools, 15 children helped to get Aadhar card, 12 orphans benefited from Palak Mata-Pita Yojna.
- SSSS Gandhinagar Childline as a part of “Task Force” with Police Department and District Child Protection Unit (DCPU) raided 14 cases of child labour directly and 47 cases of begging have been rescued & children are sent to rehabilitation centers.
- 5 child marriages were intercepted on the spot by SSSS Gandhinagar Childline with the support of Police Department (PI), Child Marriage Prohibition Officer, Social Defense Officer and DCPU.
- 14 cases of missing children handled and reunited them with their families.
- Local newspapers and media ensured printing & publishing all procedures initiated, intervention carried out and programs enhanced by SSSS child line.

Gujarat Emergency Flood Response

An inclusive and sensitive approach in relief work

Since 01/06/2017 to 01/08/2017, at least 224 people died in floods in Banaskantha, Gujarat due to rain-related causes. More than 113,000 people were evacuated to safety and more than 17,000 of them were rescued with the help of IAF, BSF, NDRF and SDRF.

Many charitable organizations, religious organizations, individuals, corporate houses, various clubs etc. responded immediately to natural disasters & provided immediate relief to the affected people. Many people themselves were pointing out at the discrimination in the relief works and in the rehabilitation process. Consequently, the most vulnerable people were left out from the relief support. At this juncture, SSSS ensured inclusion of the most vulnerable and marginalised in its relief work through the support of Caritas India by approaching its local counter parts at Vadgam, Patan and Deesa to assess the damage and to come up with immediate relief requirement.



SSSS through its local partners decided the following:

- Villages of Kankrej taluka to be supported and villages of the same taluka where relief material is over flooded should not be taken up.
- Whichever village / locality is taken up, all households should be included. Nobody should be left out.
- Instead of giving food packages and water, the families should be supported with the food grain, oil, blankets, seed kits, some hygiene material etc.
- These families should be supported with food grain and oil to sustain for at least one month. This is required as they won't be able to go for work and earn money to buy ration for the family.

The need assessment was carried out with participation of five member committee in which two members had to be women. The same committee was also involved in the distribution of relief material in the form of kits.

The distribution system followed the following process:

- The committee prepared list of ration card holders.
- The committee also announced the list and ensured that no one was left out.
- All villagers were also informed of what they would receive as relief material.
- Each ration card holder signed after the relief material was received by them.

SSSS ensured inclusion of all households and communities. It also ensured inclusion of the most vulnerable and marginalised. All the beneficiaries appreciated this approach. They say that many came and helped but nobody helped like this organization. This approach was seen as transparent, participatory and inclusive by all.



Major Intervention

Celebration of Birthday Party (24/04/2017)

- Childline staff encourages children to respect the precious gift of life.
- Childline trained leaders to support the children in their own area.
- Childline inspired children for happiness of life through some games and methods of teaching.
- Motivation of children strengthened to get their rights.

State Level Child Labor Event (12/06/017)

- Event organized for children to be free from labour work from various places like industrial area, restaurants and hotels & construction areas.
- Labour Department arranged some activities as part of Task Force for the children involved in labour.
- Children understood the worth of choosing one's life career.
- Children grasped the new act of child labor.

Rakhi Celebration (05/08/2017)

- Childline team organized Raksha bandhan day at children home in Gandhinagar. The bond of family became the prime focus.
- 60 children tied Rakhi to those who would be missing their homes.
- Sweets & snacks distributed to adorn the day.

Garba Program (29/09/2017)

- Childline Staff in collaboration with D.C.P.U organized navratri program in different schools of Gandhinagar.
- 24 x 7 emergency services of childline communicated to them all
- Garba Competition organized for differently able children and for orphan children.
- Those organizations engaged in children upliftment too participated in garba. Around 70 of them contributed.
- Government departments also showed interest in children and distributed prizes for best garba performers

Blind Walk Rally Program (12/10/2017)

- Blindfolded rally for 2 kms was organized on world vision day. Nearly 500 people participated
- 40 hand sticks distributed to the visually impaired children.
- 51 people registered to donate their eyes after death
- Banners hoisted and pamphlets distributed to disseminate awareness of Childline 1098.

Awareness training for Police Dept Staff (07/11/2017)

- Information disseminated of Childline helpline 24 x7 to Police Constables
- Discussion & handling of child related cases on priority basis in a speedy manner
- Childline 1098 toll free number to be an immediate guide.

Kite Flying Celebration (13/01/2018)

- Human chain of 1098 with school children demonstrated and importance imparted
- Arranged for kite flying with a caution and advice to save environment and birds.
- Children overjoyed in flying kites together with their schoolmates

Women's day Celebration (08/03/2018)

- Invoking God's presence through a prayer dance, the event embarked
- The gracious presence of 250 women beautified and dignified the day.
- Inputs on Women's progress in the society elevated the motivation of the women
- Dancing to the folk music, singing local melodies and displaying the art of women's power.
- Duty & responsibility of caring for children and service of Childline 1098 appreciated

Girl Child Day Celebration (03/09/2017)

- 186 children from different partner locations participated
- Childline staff arranged the entire event with inputs, external resources and cultural activities
- Main focus was on child rights and protection and Childline related 24 x 7 services
- Dancing & singing Garba enthused the celebration.



Grassroot level Intervention

It is with much difficulty we gained the confidence of the people in and around Umru-Siddhpur and thus began a women's cooperative society. Sabarmati Samruddhi Seva Sangh, the social work wing of the Archdiocese of Gandhinagar was instrumental in helping us to reach out to the people of this vicinity. Fr. Salvadore Fernandes was generous to provide personnel like Mr. Vaibhav Macwan and Mr. Jaifin Dund to strengthen our work in this vicinity. After the inaugural event at Pethapur on 12th November 2017, Mr. Macwan and Mr. Dund visit the centre every month and meet women and explain to them all about cooperative society and future bank. It is indeed a great breakthrough in this area. Although it is a tough place to work still regular visit of the project coordinators is amazing. We are working hard and hopefully go ahead with this work of Sangath. - **Fr. Xavier James, Siddhpur.**



Sabarmati Samruddhi Seva Sangh, Gandhinagar (SSSS) supported Catholic Church, Deesa to give relief to the affected families of Deesa area. We could reach out to 323 families. The relief kit contained 10 kgs wheat, 10 kgs Bajri, 2 kgs Mogar Moong Daal, 1 litre edible oil and 1 kg sugar.

Selection of Beneficiaries:

The village leaders prepared the list of affected families. After due selection of beneficiaries, we distributed the relief kit to 323 families in seven villages namely Baiwada, Jerda, Chekra, Varan, Taleiganj, Gharnal and Dedol.

Implementation:

We procured the kit items from the local traders and we fixed up the dates for distribution in seven villages. We distributed the provisions for 323 families in seven villages with the help of local volunteers. We took signature / thumb impression from each beneficiary.

In view of formation of Self Help Groups, social work office of Kalol made frequent visits from June 2017 to Aug 2017 to our different villages. Those women, who had known about SHGs and its functioning, led an awareness campaign with the support of the sisters for more women to join in the social advantageous action. We began with only five groups having to save Rs. 100 /- per month. During monthly meet, a lot of inputs on various social concerns were disseminated. These informed women participated in Archdiocesan Social Service events organized by SSSS like girl child day, rally on international women's day, etc. By the end of financial year of 2017-18, we formed 137 women SHGs with savings to the tune of Rs. 3, 50,000.00. Internal loaning was an added advantage for these women to have come together. 27 women already benefited in internal loan. Our vision is to bring all these SHGs into a saving & credit co-operative societies. We receive all the necessary guidelines and technical support from SSSS to grow in our vision and strengthen the bonds of women to a self dignified economic standard of life. - **Sr. Mary Simon, Sisters of Charity of St. Anne, Kalol**





Grassroot level Intervention

We are happy that the social work center of Archdiocese of Gandhinagar has responded immediately to meet the needs for the flood affected poor tribal families of Banaskantha District.

We, the Catholic Ashram received the message through whatsapp and email from SSSS for immediate flood relief for poor tribal people in Banaskantha district. Fr. Julian Raj visited the villages consecutively for three days namely Dabeli, Chikenvas, Danpura, Ajapura Mota, Jambur and Rabaran and assessed the damage caused by the floods. We appealed for help.

With the help of the some village leaders and people we finalized the list of families for immediate support. The final list of beneficiaries was handed over to Fr. Nelson D'Souza. We received some food grains, clothes, vessels and note books for the relief. With the help of the hostel children, we prepared 118 kits for flood affected tribal poor families. On 11th of September, we took the food grains and went to Dabeli, Chikenvas and Danpura villages for distribution. With the help of our animator Naranbhai and village people, we distributed the kits to the affected families. On 14th we distributed relief kits to Rabaran, Surela and Ajapur Mota and on 15th we supported Jambur community: - **Fr. Nelson D'Souza, Palanpur**



Relief work during floods:

Once again there was heavy flood in Sept 2017. Most of the people lost their crops; grains that was stored for the year. Some people lost their animals, houses and even their personal belongings. **275 families** were helped during floods with the help given by our sisters of Anand, Dadhwad, Zankhvav and the people of Maninagar (Ahmedabad). Our target groups were widows and elderly couples who have no support whatsoever and are very poor. Besides our regular villages, we reached out to other villages in need. All those came to our premises were never sent empty handed. They were grateful for whatever received. It also gave us an opportunity to be with them in times of crisis. We do keep in touch with them through our visits.



Medical checkup during Relief work:

Medical checkup was done in three villages with the help of Dr. (Sr.) Annette Fernandes F.C. and her team from Zankhvav, Surat District. Medicines were given free to all those in need. **97 patients** benefitted.



Widows Get -together:

50 Widows attended the gathering held on 3rd December 2017. They were very happy to meet each other. They shared about their position in the society, the difficulties and problems they face as widows. It was heart breaking to hear as some of them have struggled all alone in life to bring up the families with no help even from their in-laws and nearest relatives. - **Sr. Lucy, Karuna Niketan, Radhanpur**

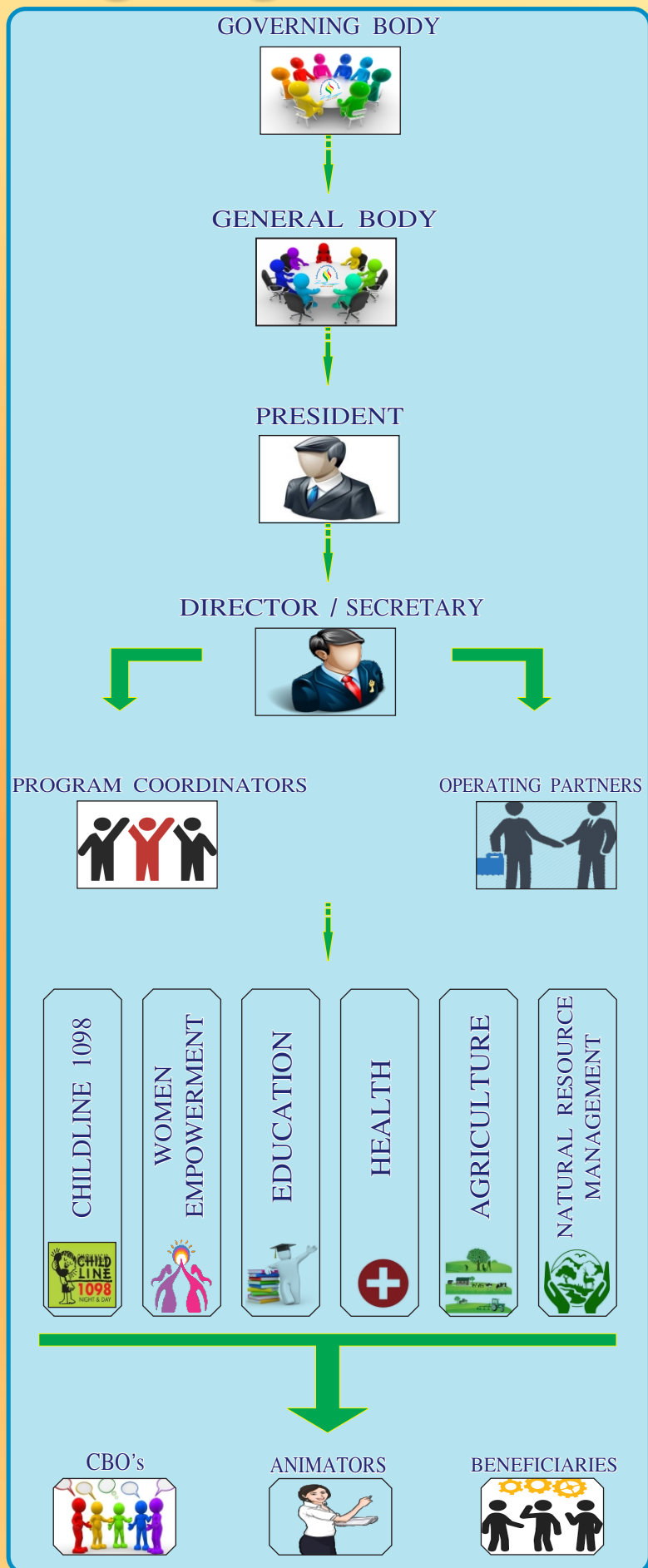
