



We have brought professionalism into Social Work with proper Staff trainings, documentations, grass root level follow up, and implementations of the projects. Since it is a value-based profession, we have tried to apply the principles of professional social work such as Acceptance, Purposeful expression of feeling, Non-judgmental attitude, Objectivity, Controlled emotional involvement, Self-determination, Confidentiality, Access to resources and Accountability.

SSSS is grateful to Manos Unidas personnel Ana Carcamo & Chiqui Cabido who came to visit our project areas of NICE (Nutrition Improvement through Community Empowerment) and were overwhelmed with marvelous difference the project has brought to the rural women. They have asked SSSS to continue the work in these areas and assured their assistance. Manos Unidas has granted their support through CHANGE (Child and Mother's Health is to be improved And promoted through Nutrition programme in north Gujarat Environment). Caritas India has extended their help through Sanjivini Phase II after the completion of Phase I. ERRIN project has helped rehabilitation of 44 returnees and their families from Germany through Caritas. CEI's mother & child safety project has been completed which has helped many lactating mothers and children. Sangath has registered four more women's cooperatives through the generosity of CEI. Child line India Foundation has funded to reach out to the vulnerable children and brought newness in our relationship. CBRF has helped us in reaching out to persons with disabilities.

COVID 19 Pandemic shook the whole world and our beloved nation. Gujarat state and especially our field areas of 6 civil districts of the Archdiocese also had a challenging time. Through the coordination with the district collector of Gandhinagar and Women & Child Welfare department, SSSS could reach out to the whole Archdiocese. The first phase was to reach out to all our parishes and villages with preventive materials and Manos Unidas Ms. Ana Carcamo came to our aid at once. The second phase was to survey and distribute food grains to daily wagers, poor, needy, women, children, youth, widows, widowers, migrants, orphans etc. in all the 6 districts of the Archdiocese. This was done in a professional way with proper survey & documentation. This was possible through the generous help of Archdiocese of Gandhinagar, Manos Unidas, SPICMA, Caritas India, Priests, Sisters, Lay Catholic faithful, Well-wishers from far and near. The third phase was to reach out with essential things to the migrants who were walking to their homes. In all these SSSS staff has done a commendable service. We could realize the blessings of our Lord who said, "Whatsoever you do to the least of my brothers and sisters you do it unto me"

I want to express my gratitude to our beloved Archbishop Thomas Macwan, Priests, Sisters, SSSS Staff and Well-wishers for their accompaniment, prayers and encouragement. I pray Our Blessed Mother Mary intercedes for SSSS and the Eucharistic Lord guides every step we take.






## Preamble of Organization

Sabarmati Samruddhi Seva Sangh, Gandhinagar (SSSS) is a Charitable, Voluntary, and Non-Governmental Organization (NGO) working in six civil districts of North Gujarat namely Aravalli, Banaskantha, Gandhinagar, Mehsana, Patan and Sabarkantha.

The Society & the Trust was registered with the Charity Commissioner on 19th July 2003, bearing Society reg. no Guj/1077/Gandhinagar & Trust reg. no. F/1033/Gandhinagar. The main objective of the Society is upliftment of the poor and the marginalized from the rural areas of North Gujarat. At present the society is actively involved in empowerment of poor and marginalized especially women and children through various programmes like empowerment through Women's Co-operatives, trainings on Health and Hygiene, Reduction of Infant Mortality Rate, Mother Mortality Rate, Improvement in RCH status, Help line for Children through Childline 1098 reaching out to vulnerable children, ERRIN reaching out to the foreign returnees to India, Mainstreaming of persons with disabilities in all SSSS programmes etc. The office bearers of the Society are committed social workers who have devoted their lives for the service and dignity of humanity. Society is also actively involved in promoting income-generating programmes through Women's Co-operatives.





## Health Programmes

Sabarmati Samruddhi Seva Sangh has implemented three projects in Health Sector. One is <u>N</u>utrition <u>Improvement through Community Empowerment (NICE)</u> another is Sanjivani: Food and Nutrition Security Programme. Third is Mother & Child Safety. These projects began fight against malnutrition in April 2017 in 61 villages of Aravalli & Banaskantha districts. It has covered multi sectoral strategy: developing Kitchen Garden, Acres of land brought under multi crop, Women farmers involved in multi crop cultivation, Applied for other govt. schemes, water, sanitation & hygiene, nutrition- sensitive health care, education, celebrations of world anemic day, nutrition week, hand wash day, exposure to kitchen garden, exposure visit to agriculture university, health camps, etc., These have enabled empowerment of women & balanced physical growth of infants & children.



### Achievement of "Nutrition Improvement through Community Empowerment (NICE)":

- > 39 Village Health Committee (VHCs) have worked as pressure groups in the villages & resolved health issues and village issues like cleanliness, midday meal, applied Government schemes, tank etc. issues have been taken up.
- > 6000 men and women attended & are sensitized on nutrition.
- > 99% pregnant mothers began going to health centre for ANC & PNC.
- ➤ 468 awareness programmes on malnutrition to communities have been conducted and 6140 people attended.
- > 1170 Organic Kitchen garden were created and managed by the community.
- Mothers have changed their pattern of behaviour in giving supplementary food for the children after six months. It was 90% and it has gone up to 98% in 2020.
- As a result of awareness created among women (mothers) on the importance of immunization, rate of immunization has increased from 81.05% in 2017 to 100% in 2020.
- > 78 hand wash day were conducted 913 children participated in it.
- > 1459 People were availed of Rs. 21,15,700.00 Cash & Kind on Govt. schemes.















## Health Programmes

### Achievement of "Sanjivani: Food and Nutrition Security Programme":

Looking at the grave scenario of malnutrition in North Gujarat, SSSS implemented Project- *Sanjivani*: Food and Nutrition Security Programme in four villages of Danta block of Banaskantha district of Gujarat.

### **Objectives Achieved:**

- 1. Households have increased food diversity with sustainable agriculture, crop diversification and with the collection of uncultivated food.
- 2. Households have gained access to the benefits of food and nutrition security schemes and programmes.
- 3. Collective community actions for achieving food & nutrition security:
  - > Create 40 organic kitchen gardens: against that we created 70 kitchen gardens, most of these kitchen gardens are developed by women farmers and school going and adolescent girls.
  - Increase land use for multi-crop: the target was of 60 acres, however, the achievements made were much more than the project. Participants increased 80 acres of land under multi crop.
  - > 100 women farmers turned into multi crop cultivation: against that we managed to motivate 250 women farmers for multi crop cultivation
  - There were 60 women who not only got involved in multi crop cultivation but also cultivated traditional crops. Women farmers have shown much more interest in cultivating traditional crops and they have collected traditional grain & vegetable seeds, more women farmers are turning to multi crop cultivation during winter.
  - ▶ 866 project participants accessed various Government schemes that includes 255 families who received financial support to build sanitation facilities, although we had applied for 270 sanitation facilities. Linked 33 women for widow pension scheme, 26 adolescents girls have registered in Poshan Abiyan, 84 farmers have been given "haak patrak" for farming in forest land from forest department, 75 job cards are prepared for timmru tree leaves collection. They got Rs. 7500/- cheque per family. 5 families received electricity connections, 10 families received new ration cards, and 80 pregnant women got registered into Mamta Diwas, adolescent girls and lactating mothers were linked with nutrition supplementary programme.

## Achievement of "MOTHER AND CHILD SAFETY PROGRAMME":

### **Objectives Achieved:**

- 1. Infant Mortality Rate is reduced by 50%.
- 2. Maternal Mortality Rate is reduced to 0%.
- 3. Complete Ante Natal Care is increased by 30% .
- 4. Twenty Village Health Workers are fully trained on health issues.

## **Empowerment Programmes**

**"SANGATH LIFE"** stands for Strengthening Capacities of Collective Enterprise of 5 Co-operatives from the marginalized Communities of 2 Districts of Gujarat leading women to their Empowerment and Socio-Economic Development. The following were the major activities of the project conducted during the year. 2019-2020 saw many vicissitudes in

Sangath Life project due to Corona pandemic. Yet many programmes were successful through hard work. These include leadership training, availing credit facilities training, marketing function & strategies training, training on PRI, Cooperative account & documentation training, orientation on Govt. schemes, livelihood trainings like tailoring, handicraft, & kitchen garden and beauty parlour training is currently underway.





SSSS staff and center animators were active even during COVID 19. The amount for saving and loan was collected from the Cooperative members, by going from home to home with safety measures of Corona Pandemic. Relief materials such as preventive, food grains were distributed to the needy members.

Without registration, any cooperative is disenchanted. Therefore, some

decent results came out during the year. In SANGATH LIFE project there are five collaborators namely Kadi, Mandali, Mehsana, Siddhpur, Patan (Radhanpur). Among these partners, Mehsana center has already registered with name of Sahiyar Divya Jyot Mahila Bachat ane Dhiran Sahkari Mandli Ltd. with their district registrar in the year 2018-19. Now, Sahiyar Divy Jyot Cooperative is running very well by the members of the Core Committee and under Sr.Nirmala's guidance. This year, SSSS formed three more cooperatives namely 1) Fatima Mahila Bachat ane Dhiran Sahkari Mandli Ltd, Mandali, 2) Shitalchhaya Mahila Bachat ane Dhiran Sahkari Mandli Ltd, Siddhpur, 3) Sanjivani Mahila Bachat ane Dhiran Sahkari Mandli Ltd, Radhanpur(Patan). All these process were completed in a period of only 2 months, which is a great success for SSSS team.

Thus, so far Sabarmati Samruddhi Seva Sangh has formed nine co-operatives in the Archdiocese of Gandhinagar.

They are: Deesa, Vadgam, Khiloda, Nana Kantharia, Meghraj, Mandali, Mehsana, Siddhpur, and Radhanpur.

## **Empowerment Programmes**

European Returnee Reintegration Network Programme (ERRIN) helps illegal migrants to get back to their home country in a dignified manner. It further supports in their livelihood establishment, educational and vocational training, medical assistance and takes care of the other important aspects such as legal migration, counseling, documentation etc. In a very short span SSSS got very noticeable achievement. As per latest update, SSSS helped 44 families with support of Rs. 58,72,127/- for establishing Livelihood, Education, Medical, Accommodation, Government Schemes and other services in the Archdiocese of Gandhinagar. During this year, SSSS supported 19 families worth of Rs. 31, 31,585/- for their rehabilitation. In addition, 11 families are in the process.

Local Awareness and programmes were held at various Schools, Shelter Homes and Govt Department like Civil Hospital, Bus Stand, and Railway station CHC, PHC, Anganwadi centers, Gardens and Mother and Child Related Charitable Trusts. ### State Level Programme on World day Against Child Labour

- UNICEF defines "**child labour** as work that exceeds a minimum number of hours, depending on the age of a child and on the type of work. Such work is considered harmful to the child and should be eliminated:
- Students of Labour institute presented a short skit on Child labour.

### Celebration of World disability Day

International day of persons with disabilities was celebrated in Gandhinagar Archdiocese on 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2019 by SSSS. In commemoration to mark the World Disability day, a rally was held at St. Xavier's School, Gandhinagar. His Grace Archbishop Thomas Macwan, Metropolitan Archbishop of Gandhinagar flagged off the rally which was for half an hour. On reaching St. Xavier's School campus, Mr. Victor Mecwan, IAS and His Grace Archbishop spoke and encouraged the persons with disabilities to do their best and grab the government entitlements. 100 Children and staff from Gandhinagar blind school and deaf and mute school were overjoyed as many people came to show their solidarity with them. SSSS Childline staff did a wonderful work with the support of Fr. Cruze, Principal of St. Xavier's School, Gandhinagar.



### **International Children's Day Celebration**

A week long children's day celebration began on 14<sup>th</sup> November and ended on 21<sup>st</sup> November 2019. Child line 1098 of SSSS staff had organized several programmes in the schools and slums such as storytelling, Rangoli, Drawing, Painting, Quiz competitions etc. The culmination was with cutting of cake with the Superintendent of Police of Gandhinagar district and children. Ms. Teresa Benedict from Child India Foundation & Fr. Xavier James, Director of SSSS were present for the event.

### **Swatch Bharat Mission Programme**


On 6th March 2020 SSSS Child line organized Mega Event on Swatch Bharat Mission. The Additional Collector was the Guest of Honour to distribute Prizes to the winners. It was held for Three Months and Childline Team had organized SBM Programme. Childline Team arranged various activities like Tree plantation, Speech on Swatchta, Cleaning Campaign, To make Art & Craft, and Drawing & Painting on Swatch Bharat Mission. 1400 children participated this campaign.





### Name of the programme: - Covid-19 Relief work

SSSS had arranged the Staff meeting for Covid-19 Relief work. The staff had made pre planning to work for covid 19 to buy & distribute Preventive materials and dry ration kits. It had Coordination meetings with the Collector, S.P, Labour Officer and Block Officer for the Process of permission to help the poorest of the poor children.

Abrupt lockdown in the country was a big blow for the people who live their lives on daily wages. This is what happened when the lockdown was announced. 




