

May the peace of Christ always be with you!





# Preamble of Organization

**Sabarmati Samruddhi Seva Sangh, Gandhinagar (SSSS)** is a Charitable, Voluntary, and Non-Governmental Organization (NGO) working in six civil districts of North Gujarat namely Aravalli, Banaskantha, Gandhinagar, Mehsana, Patan and Sabarkantha.

The Society & the Trust were registered with the Charity Commissioner on 19th July 2003, bearing Society reg. no Guj/1077/Gandhinagar & Trust reg. no. F/1033/Gandhinagar. The main objective of the Society is for the upliftment of the poor and the marginalized from the rural areas of North Gujarat. At present the society is actively involved in empowerment of the poor and marginalized especially women and children through various programmes like empowerment through Women's Co-operatives, trainings on Health and Hygiene, Reduction of Infant Mortality Rate, Mother Mortality Rate, Improvement in RCH status, Help line for Children through Childline 1098 reaching out to vulnerable children, ERRIN reaching out to the foreign returnees to India, Mainstreaming of persons with disabilities in all SSSS programmes, Reaching out to migrants in the area etc. The office bearers of the Society are committed social workers who have devoted their lives for the service and dignity of humanity. Society is also actively involved in promoting income-generating programmes through Women's Co-operatives and healthy and nutritious life style in rural area.

Training on Malnutrition was conducted from 10th to 12th September 2020 for 13 Community Educators and 4 Partners. Mrs. Sharmila facilitated this training. She made the training programme easy and simple to understand that made Community Educators to work more energetically.

*The topics of this training programme were as follows:*

- What is malnutrition?
- Malnutrition signs and symptoms.
- Malnutrition causes and diagnosis.
- Malnutrition treatments and Prevention.

# Health Programme

## Training on Nutritious Food to Community Educators :

Training on Right food was conducted from 15<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> December 2020 for 15 Community Educators. Ms. Sharmila Mendonza & Mr. Ashwin Dantani facilitated the training. They put all their efforts to make them understand the topic in distinct and clear terms. Topics covered by this training were as follows: Simple ways to increase the nutritional value of food to make nutritious soup, to make Nutrition parathas, How to make Nutritious food for baby, Multi grain cereal food for kids, food to be taken during pregnancy & how to make vegetable, beans, rice, sweets, salads.

## NICE – II

The Project NICE – II was inaugurated on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2021 with the financial support of Manos Unidas. At present, Survey work is going on with 4 centers, 39 Villages and 13 Community Educators.

**13 Community Educators from 39 villages:** Partners appointed one village health worker for three villages. They were selected mostly from the target villages itself keeping in mind the person's ability to take initiative and communication skills.



**Project orientation to Community Educators & Partners:** Orientation to 13 Community Educators and 4 Partners on Nutrition Improvement through Community Empowerment (NICE Phase – 2) project was conducted on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2021. Mr. Anil Dabhi gave overall view of goal, objectives & activities of the project so that they could attain distinct clarity regarding the project work and their responsibilities. It is true that through the initiatives of Community Educators their respective community has become aware of the goal, objective and activities of the project.

## Sanjivani – III

This Project was launched in Ujjain on 01<sup>st</sup> March 2021. At present survey work is in progress. There are 10 villages of Danta taluka in this programme. It is funded by Misereor through Caritas India.



# Empowerment Programme

## “Sangath Life”



“Sangath Life” – Strengthening Capacities of Marginalized Communities through Empowerment and Socio-Economic Development The project aimed at bringing more than 655 members of small SHGs from different villages and to form a bigger platform in the form of 5 cooperative societies to address effectively the socio-economic issues of the tribal and other marginalized women in the operational areas of Mehsana and Patan districts in Gujarat. We have been successful in mobilizing SHG members to form 5 credit cooperative societies and get them registered as per rules and regulations of the cooperative society during the last two years of the project term we have also been able to provide alternative livelihood skills to cooperative members through various training programmes such as kitchen gardening, production through vegetable, preparing handicraft articles, and tailoring. On the other hand, NABARD has also provided moral support to conduct training programme to 40 cooperative members on handicrafts, KVK has provided technical inputs to women in green house agriculture production, National bank have been able to give loans to cooperative members and Taluka (Block) level livelihood mission units have been linked for handicraft marketing linkages.

We have organized training programme like Availing Credit Facilities, Leadership training, Panchayati Raj Institutions training, Marketing Function & Strategies training, Documentation & Accounting training, and Modern Education like Basic Computer Knowledge & English language. The five partner centers namely Kadi with 36 women, Mandali with 165 women, Mehsana with 226 women, Patan (Radhanpur) with 154 women and Siddhpur 105 women gained knowledge and skills in these trainings. In total, the numbers of women that have participated and gained knowledge about credit facilities were 665. After the training, they are given certificates, which help them for Government entitlement.



Most of the cooperatives are doing small-scale business by the cooperative societies. Partner of Mehsana has opened a shop of its own in their location and selling school uniforms, women garments. Partner of Mandali and Cooperative members are involved in Beauty Parlour and handicraft materials business and selling cosmetic items, mehndi & hosiery Items, which are prepared by Cooperative members. On the other hand, Leadership, Marketing Function & Strategies, availing credit facilities, PRI, Awareness about Govt. Scheme, and Modern Education trainings with full facilities was a boost to their self-confidence, inter personal skills and business.

It further supports in their livelihood establishment, educational and vocational training, medical assistance and takes care of the other important aspects are such as legal migration, counseling, documentation, etc. In a very short span SSSS got noticeable achievement. As per latest update, SSSS & Caritas India supported 44 families with support of Rs. 77, 59,782/- for establishing Livelihood, Education, Medical, Accommodation and other services. During 2020-2021 SSSS Gandhinagar Child line Team received various types of Calls like Child Labour, Missing child, Education related, Child Abuse and Violence, child in conflict with Law, Child related family Issues, Medical, Nutrition help etc.

Local Awareness Programmes were held at various Schools, Shelter Homes and Govt Department like Civil Hospital, Bus Stand, Police Station and Railway station, CHC, PHC, Anganwadi centers, Garden and Mother and Child Related working Charitable Trusts, Religious & Picnic spots. At these field areas, SSSS Childline Team gives awareness about Childline service and its process, Government schemes and distribution of Childline Posters, IEC material. In this Year Childline Team covered 3200 children and 160 stakeholders through Video Screening, Street play on Childline service and its process.

# 24x7 Service of Childline 1098

## Major Intervention

### Celebration of World disability Day ►

International day of persons with disabilities was celebrated in Gandhinagar Archdiocese on 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2020 by SSSS. In commemoration to mark, the World Disability day childline team gave dry ration kit to 65 disabled children and provided medical kit during corona situation.



### ◀ International Children's Day Celebration

A week long children's day celebration began on 14<sup>th</sup> November 2020 and ended on 21<sup>st</sup> November 2020. Childline 1098 of SSSS staff had organized several programmes in the Rural & slums such as storytelling, Rangoli, Drawing, Painting, Quiz competitions and winners were given award.

### Swatch Bharat Mission Programme ►

Due to COVID situation, Team focused on children's hand wash activity. Team felt that the poor children in the slums need to sleep well at night and so distributed blankets to the children in Gandhinagar.



### ❖ 2 circulars were passed in the police department

a) A circular was made available by Additional Director General of Police I.P.S Shri Anil Pratham sir with the Purpose of providing good support to the Childline team in finding the missing children with the help of Police Department.

b) The Deputy Superintendent of Police and Nodal Officer of the Police Department, Mr. Solanki Sir made another circular available on the purpose of providing support to the Childline team for legal assistance pertaining to children.



### ◀ Psycho-Social support was provided to children

The Covid pandemic has had a devastating effect on children's behaviour. The children are terrified and not getting the right information. To keep the children away from such serious situations, Childline provided Psycho-Social support to more than 560 children by energizing them with various games and entertainment.

### Aadhar Card Camp ►

Some families in slum areas do not have information on where and how to obtain a new Aadhar card for their children. In addition, the children were afraid to go out in Covid situation. Therefore, the Childline team coordinated with the Aadhar card department and organized Aadhar card camp and 48 new Aadhar cards were issued to the children and Childline team reached the Aadhar cards to respective children.
